Religion Knowledge Organiser - Year 5



Creation

The formulation of the Universe-the "Big bang" was the moment of creation and therefore the work of God.

Genesis

The first book in the Old Testament. This book tells the story of how Earth was created and how humans became sinners.

Steward

A person committed to selfless service. A person who provides for the glory of God and creation.

Garden of Eden

A beautiful garden where Adam and Eve were placed at the creation where they disobeyed God and ate the forbidden fruit.

Adam and Eve

The first man and the first woman. The book of genesis tells us that God breathed life into Adam from dust and he created Eve by using one of Adam's ribs.

Original Sin

The result of Adam and Eve disobeying God, being tempted and eating the forbidden fruit.

Freedom

The power to think, act and speak whenever a person wants.

<u>Serpent</u>

Can be in the form, of a snake; in religious terms it is the devil.

Respect

To have consideration towards the feelings, wishes and rights of others.

Canticle

A hymn or a chant, used in religious services and Masses.

- Why did God make us?
- How does caring for our world affect behaviour?
